How to Cite Content in Project MUSE

The formats shown here are for citing journal articles and books in the “works cited” or reference list. Contact your institution’s library for more information about citing research sources.

JOURNAL ARTICLES

MLA Style

FORMAT:

Author Last Name, First Name. "Title of Article." *Journal Name*, vol., no., Year, page(s). *Project MUSE*, DOI.

EXAMPLE:

Ross, Patricia A. "The Fact Value Dichotomy in Demarcating *Disorder*." *Philosophy, Psychiatry, & Psychology*, vol. 14, no. 2, 2007, pp. 107-09. *Project MUSE*, DOI: 10.1353/ppp.0.0013.

APA Style

FORMAT:

Author Last Name, First Name. (Year). Article title. *Journal Name*, volume number(issue number, if applicable), page number(s). Retrieved Month day, year, from Project MUSE database.

EXAMPLE:

Grady, Frank. (2003). Arnoldian Humanism, or Amnesia and Autobiography in the Schwarzenegger Action Film. *Cinema Journal*, 42(2), 41-56. Retrieved September 4, 2004 from Project MUSE database.

BOOKS

MLA Style

FORMAT:

Author Last Name, First Name. *Book title*. Place of publication: Publisher, Publication date. *Project MUSE*, URL. Day Month Year of access

EXAMPLES:

Treuer, Anton. *Assassination of Hole in the Day*. St. Paul: Minnesota Historical Society Press, 2010. *Project MUSE*, muse.jhu.edu/book/704. Accessed 10 Apr. 2017.

APA Style

FORMAT:

Author Last Name, Initials. (Publication date). *Book title*. Place of publication: Publisher. Retrieved from URL

EXAMPLES:

Weintraub, S. (2011). *Farewell, Victoria!* Greensboro, NC: ELT Press. Retrieved from <http://muse.jhu.edu>

Conteh-Morgan, J. (2010). *New Francophone African and Caribbean Theatres*. African Expressive Cultures. Bloomington, IN: Indiana University Press. Retrieved from <http://muse.jhu.edu>
