



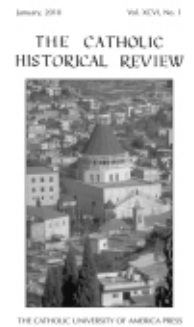

Loza, Steven (Ed.). *Religion as Art: Guadalupe, Orishas, and Sufi*. (Albuquerque: University of New Mexico Press. 2009. Pp. xiv, 354. \$39.95 paperback.) Among the two dozen articles published here are "Municipal Art in Early Guadalupan Processions" by Martinus Cawley (pp. 24-39); "Our Lady of Guadalupe in Historical Perspective" by Stafford Poole, C.M. (pp. 58-69); and "The Presence of Miguel Bernal Jiménez in the Fiftieth Anniversary of the Coronation of the Virgin of Guadalupe [1945]" by Lorena Díaz Núñez (pp. 117-27).

McBride, Alfred, O.P. *The Story of the Church*. (Cincinnati: St. Anthony Messenger Press. 2009. Pp. x, 310. \$16.95 paperback.) Originally published in 1983.

McLaughlin, David J. *The California Missions Source Book: Key Information, Dramatic Images, and Fascinating Anecdotes Covering All 21 Missions*. (Scottsdale, AZ: Pentacle Press. Distributed by the University of New Mexico Press, Albuquerque. 2009. Pp. 68, \$24.95 paperback.) Following a foreword, which is really a general introduction (pp. 11-21), a two-page spread is devoted to each mission. The spiral-bound book, printed on glossy paper, is lavishly illustrated in full color, with reproductions of old artists' drawings, engravings, paintings, architectural drawings, and contemporary photographs. The afterword (pp. 65-68) recounts the effects of the secularization decree of 1833.

Moorcroft, Jennifer. *God Is All Joy: Life of St. Teresa of the Andes*. (Washington, DC: ICS Publications. 2009. Pp. x, 164. \$12.95 paperback.) A popular life of the first canonized saint of Chile (1900-19).

Nederman, Cary J. *John of Salisbury*. [Medieval and Renaissance Texts and Studies, Vol. 288.] (Tempe: Arizona State University Center for Medieval Studies and Renaissance Studies. 2005. Pp. xii, 100. \$15.00 paperback.) Written for undergraduates and other beginners, and not intended to impact scholarly discussion.

Porterfield, Amanda. *Healing in the History of Christianity*. (New York: Oxford University Press. 2009. Pp. viii, 218. \$22.95.) Originally published in 2005.

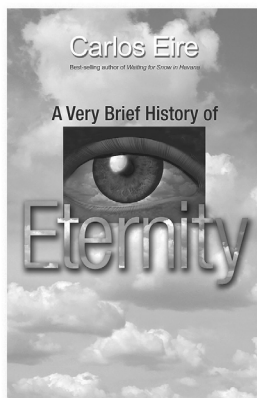
