



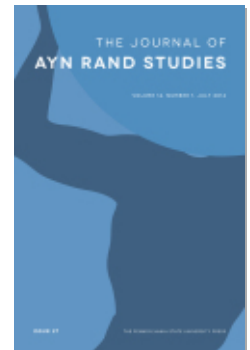

She wrote the trailblazing 1978 *College English* article “Ayn Rand and Feminism: An Unlikely Alliance,” which ultimately inspired the provocative 1999 volume in the Pennsylvania State University Press book series, “Re-reading the Canon,” *Feminist Interpretations of Ayn Rand*, co-edited by Gladstein and Chris Matthew Sciabarra. The series currently sports thirty-five volumes, each covering a major thinker in the Western canon, from Plato, Aristotle, and Immanuel Kant to Hannah Arendt,

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
