

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# Art of Asia Acquired by North American Museums, 2006–2008








Pair of Qiangjin sutra covers. China. Ming dynasty. 1403–1424. Cover B front view.




3B. Pair of Qiangjin sutra covers. China. Ming dynasty. 1403–1424. Cover B details.

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











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








25. Unidentified artist. Ten Thousand Miles Along the Yellow River. China. Qing dynasty, 18th c. Screens c & d.






