Each of your drafts should include a Peer Review Cover Sheet directed to your peer reviewers. The cover sheet contains two parts:

**Context.** In this paragraph, give a brief report to your peer reviewers about where you are in your draft. What have you done so far? What haven't you done? What are you happy with? Where are you struggling, etc.

**Questions/direction for your peer reviewers.** In this section, please direct your peer reviewer by asking for specific kinds of feedback. The peer reviewer will be free to provide a range of feedback, so this section doesn't limit them — rather it provides them an opportunity to focus their feedback in areas that might be most helpful to you.
