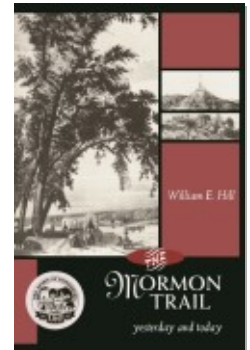

BRIGHAM YOUNG—From Piercy's *Route from Liverpool to Great Salt Lake Valley*

Brigham Young was one of the early converts to Mormonism who joined in 1832. He moved to Kirtland, was a member of Zion's Camp in 1834, and became a member of the first Quorum of Twelve Apostles in 1835. He served as a missionary to England. After the death of Joseph Smith in 1844, he was the senior apostle and became leader of the Mormon Church. He

helped to organize the exodus from Nauvoo in 1846, led the first Mormon pioneers from Winter Quarters to Salt Lake in 1847, and again led the 1848 migration. He was sustained as the second president of the Mormon Church in 1847, became the territorial governor of Utah in 1850, and continued to lead the Mormon Church until he died in 1877.
