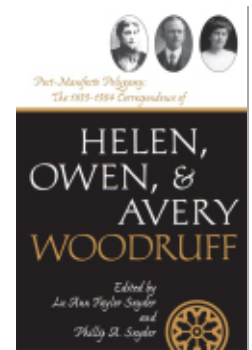

- Bailey, Josie E. Married Frank F. Allred August 20, 1902.
- Beebe, Clara Martisha Woodruff. Sister of Owen. Born July 23, 1868. Married Ovando Collins Beebe August 3, 1887.
- Beebe, Ovando "Van" Collins. Brother-in-law of Owen. Married Clara Martisha Woodruff, Owen's sister, August 3, 1887.
- Bennion, Edwin T. Brother-in-law of Avery. Brother of Heber Bennion and polygamous husband of Mary Minerva Clark, Avery's sister. Born April 8, 1868, in Salt Lake City.
- Bennion, Ethelyn "Ethel." Niece of Helen. Daughter of Heber Bennion and Susan Winters, Helen's sister. Born August 6, 1886.
- Bennion, Heber. Brother-in-law of Helen. Married Susan Marian Winters, Helen's sister, September 11, 1885. Polygamist married also to Mary Bringhurst (1902) and Emma Jane Webster (no date). Brother of Edwin T. Bennion.
- Bennion, Heber, Jr. Nephew of Helen. Son of Heber Bennion and Susan Winters, Helen's sister. Born January 30, 1888.
- Bennion, Mary Elizabeth Lindsay. First wife of Edwin T. Bennion. Born September 29, 1870, in Salt Lake City. Married in 1892.
- Bennion, Rulon Oscar. Nephew of Helen. Son of Heber Bennion and Susan Winters. Born November 14, 1900.
- Bennion, Sterling Alfred. Nephew of Helen. Son of Heber Bennion and Susan Winters. Born January 27, 1899.
- Bennion, Susan Marian Winters. Sister of Helen. Born June 25, 1859, in Payson, Utah. Married Heber Bennion September 11, 1885, in Pleasant Grove, Utah.
- Booth, Delia Ina Winters. Sister of Helen. Born May 16, 1854, in Pleasant Grove, Utah. Married John Edge Booth in 1887.
- Booth, John Edge. Brother-in-law of Helen. Born June 29, 1847, in England. Married Delia Ina Winters, Helen's sister, in 1887. Judge of the Fourth District Court.

- Booth, Milton. Nephew of Helen. Born May 21, 1888, to John Booth and Delia Winters.
- Brimhall, George H. Professor of pedagogy and later president at Brigham Young Academy. Born December 9, 1852, in Salt Lake City.
- Brixen, Julia M. Born in Sweden and baptized into LDS Church at thirteen. Sent to work in Utah to raise money to emigrate her family. Married Andrew Brixen. Called to serve in the YLMIA in 1898.
- Burgon, Willard C. Bishop of Union Ward, 1900–1910. Born November 4, 1854. Trained as a mason.
- Burrows, Emeline Woodruff. Half-sister of Owen. Daughter of Wilford Woodruff and Sarah Delight Stocking. Born July 26, 1863, in Salt Lake City. Married David Creland Burrows August 18, 1887.
- Cannon, Caroline “Carlie” Young Croxall. Daughter of Brigham Young. Born February 1, 1851. Married George Q. Cannon in 1884 after divorcing Mark Croxall.
- Cannon, George M. Cashier of the Zion’s Savings Bank and Trust Company in Salt Lake City. Born December 25, 1861, in St. George, Utah. Served with Asahel Woodruff, Owen’s brother, in the Stake Sunday School of the Granite Stake.
- Cannon, George Quayle. Ordained an LDS apostle in 1860 and served as a counselor to LDS Church presidents Brigham Young, John Taylor, Wilford Woodruff, and Lorenzo Snow. Born January 11, 1827, in England.
- Clark, Ann Eliza Porter. Mother of Avery. Born October 22, 1862, in Porterville, Utah. Married Hyrum Don Carlos Clark November 11, 1880.
- Clark, Heber D. Brother of Avery. Born July 16, 1887.
- Clark, Hyrum Taylor. Brother of Avery. Born October 3, 1885, in Idaho.
- Clark, Hyrum Don Carlos. Father of Avery. Born February 13, 1856, in Farmington, Utah. Married Ann Eliza Porter November 11, 1880, in Salt Lake City. Married Mary Alice Robinson December 27, 1903, in polygamous marriage.
- Clark, Mary Minerva. Sister of Avery. Born December 1, 1883. Married Edwin T. Bennion in 1903 polygamous marriage.
- Clawson, Rudger A. Ordained an LDS apostle in 1898. Born March 1, 1857, in Salt Lake City. Served a four-year prison term for unlawful cohabitation under Edmunds Act.
- Cowley, Lenora Taylor. Married Matthias Cowley as a plural wife September 16, 1905. Born March 28, 1885.
- Cowley, Matthias F. Ordained an LDS apostle in 1897. Born August 24, 1858, in Salt Lake City. Left the LDS Church in 1905 over its anti-polygamy policy. Reinstated in 1936.
- Crosby, Jesse W. Born June 22, 1848. Married to Sarah Pauline Clark.

- Called in 1900 to help colonize the Bighorn Basin. Served as first counselor to Byron Sessions in Big Horn Stake Presidency.
- Daynes, Winifred Blanche Woodruff. Sister of Owen. Born April 9, 1876, in Salt Lake City. Married to Joseph J. Daynes Jr. December 18, 1895.
- Daynes, Florilla Woodruff. Niece of Owen. Daughter of Joseph and Blanche Woodruff. Born November 18, 1896.
- Daynes, Joseph Donald. Nephew of Owen. Son of Joseph and Blanche Daynes. Born October 1, 1898.
- Daynes, Joseph John. Born April 2, 1851, in Norwich, England. Father of Joseph Daynes Jr., brother-in-law to Owen. Salt Lake City Tabernacle organist for thirty years.
- Daynes, Joseph John, Jr. Brother-in-law of Owen. Married Winifred Blanche Woodruff December 18, 1895, in Salt Lake City.
- Dougall, Maria Young. Daughter of Brigham Young. Born December 10, 1849. Raised by Zina D. H. Young after mother's death. Married William B. Dougall. Called in 1887 as counselor to Elmina Taylor on the General Board of the YLMIA.
- Empey, Emma Jane Evans. Wife of Nelson A. Empey. Born June 11, 1835.
- Esplin, Henry Webster. Born October 20, 1854, in Nephi, Utah. Married Phinena Cox. Bishop of Orderville, Utah, from 1884 to 1910.
- Eyring, Edward Christian. Born May 27, 1868. Married Caroline Cottam Romney in 1893 and her sister Emma Cottom Romney in 1903, sisters of Junius Romney. Resident of Colonia Juárez.
- Freeman, Ivy Leona. Niece of Helen. Born October 6, 1883, in Pleasant Grove, Utah. Daughter of William and Mary Ann Freeman, sister of Helen. Married John W. Adams March 15, 1905.
- Freeman, Mary Ann Winters. Sister of Helen. Born January 3, 1862, in Mt. Pleasant, Utah. Married William Hamblin Freeman November 25, 1880, in Salt Lake City.
- Freeman, Ruby. Niece of Helen. Born November 7, 1890, in Pleasant Grove, Utah. Daughter of William and Mary Ann Freeman. Married Roscoe Derrick Sorensen March 27, 1913, in Salt Lake City.
- Freeman, William Hamblin. Brother-in-law of Helen. Born February 4, 1858, in Harriman, Utah. Married Mary Ann Winters November 25, 1880, in Salt Lake City.
- Gates, Emma Lucy. Born November 4, 1880, in St. George, Utah. Daughter of Jacob and Susa Young Gates. Married Albert E. Bowen on June 30, 1916, in Salt Lake City. Trained in opera at Berlin's Royal Conservatory of Music.
- Gibbs, George. Personal secretary to the First Presidency of the LDS Church. Son, also named George, companion of Owen's on a hunting trip.
- Goddard, Emma. Born April 19, 1861, in England. Married Benjamin Goddard in 1883. Called to the YLMIA General Board in 1896 and served on the Journal Committee.

- Graham, Julia Sessions. Daughter of Byron Sessions. Married Walter Graham. Resident of Bighorn Basin community.
- Grant, Heber Jeddy. Helen's brother-in-law. Born November 22, 1856, in Salt Lake City. Married Lucy Stringham in 1877, Augusta Winters in 1884, and Emily Wells in 1884. Ordained an LDS apostle in 1882 and set apart as church president in 1918. When Grant served as president, Augusta was the only one of his wives still living.
- Grant, Hulda Augusta "Gusta" Winters. Sister of Helen. Born July 7, 1856, in Payson, Utah. Married Heber J. Grant in 1884.
- Grant, Rachel Ridgeway Ivins. Mother of Heber J. Grant. Born March 9, 1821, in New Jersey. Married Jedediah M. Grant November 29, 1855.
- Hickman, Ella. Wife of Professor J. E. Hickman of Brigham Young Academy. Aunt of Ovando Beebe.
- Horne, Clara Leone. Niece of Martha Horne Tingey. Born October 10, 1878, in Salt Lake City. Married Ambrey Nowell in 1904.
- Hyde, Annie Taylor. Daughter of President John Taylor. Born October 20, 1849. Married a son of Orson Hyde. Considered the founder of the Daughters of the Utah Pioneers. Called to serve as first counselor to Bathsheba Smith on LDS Relief Society General Board in 1901.
- Ivins, Anthony W. President of Juárez Stake in Mexico. Born in 1852. Married Elizabeth Ashby Snow, daughter of Erastus Snow, in 1878. Ordained an LDS apostle in 1907.
- Kearns, Thomas. Non-LDS U.S. Senator. Born April 11, 1862. Member of Utah Constitutional Convention. Became millionaire in Park City, Utah, mining industry. Built Kearns Mansion, now Utah Governor's Mansion, on South Temple Street as his personal residence. Elected by the Republican legislature as U.S. Senator in 1901, with the rumored support of LDS president Lorenzo Snow.
- Kelsch, Louis A. Associate of LDS apostle Mathias F. Cowley. Born April 28, 1857. Married Rosalia Esther Atwood.
- Kelsch, Rosalia Esther Atwood. Wife of Louis A. Kelsch.
- Kimball, Jonathan "J" Golden. Son of Heber C. Kimball. Born June 9, 1853, in Salt Lake City. Called as one of the Seven Presidents of the Seventy in 1892. Served on the YMMIA General Board.
- Lambert, Martha. Nurse of Helen during childbirth.
- Lund, Anthon Henrik. Counselor of Joseph F. Smith. Born May 15, 1844, in Denmark. Ordained an LDS apostle in 1899.
- Lyman, Francis Marion. LDS apostle ordained in 1880. Born January 12, 1840, in Illinois, the eldest son of Amasa M. Lyman. Served on the YMMIA General Board.
- Maeser, Karl G. President of Brigham Young Academy in Provo, Utah. Born January 16, 1828. Called by Brigham Young to organize academy in 1875.

- McClellan, J. J. Tabernacle organist who replaced Joseph Daynes.
- McCune, Elizabeth Claridge. Wife of Alfred W. McCune, wealthy businessman in Salt Lake City who built the McCune Mansion.
- McEwan, Emma Woodruff. Niece of Owen. Born July 9, 1902, to William McEwan and Mary Alice Woodruff.
- McEwan, Mary Alice Woodruff. Sister of Owen. Born January 2, 1879. Married William McEwan November 16, 1897.
- McEwan, William. Brother-in-law of Owen. Born November 16, 1871. Married Mary Alice Woodruff November 16, 1897.
- McMurrin, Joseph W. LDS apostle ordained in 1898. Born September 5, 1858. Served as one of the Seven Presidents of the Seventy in 1897 and on the YMMIA General Board. Helped Owen organize Bighorn Basin community.
- Murdock, Joseph Royal. Utah State Senator elected in 1900. Born August 11, 1858, in Salt Lake City. Served as member of Utah State Constitutional Convention.
- Paul, Joshua Hughes. President of LDS University in Salt Lake City. Born January 20, 1863. Taught for nine years at the University of Utah, was associate editor of the *Salt Lake Herald*, was president of the Agricultural College of Utah, and was editor of the *Deseret News* for a short time.
- Pierce, Isaac Washington. High council member of Juárez Stake. Born August 22, 1839. Moved to Colonia Diaz, Chihuahua, Mexico, with his two polygamous families in 1890. Established a retail lumber business there in 1898.
- Richards, DeForest. Governor of Wyoming elected in 1893. Born August 6, 1846, in Alabama. Married Elise Ingersoll in 1871. Moved west in 1885 and settled in Douglas, Wyoming, in 1886.
- Roberts, Brigham Henry. Prolific writer of LDS Church history and biography. Born March 13, 1857. Ordained to the First Council of the Seventy in 1888.
- Romney, Junius. Born March 12, 1878, in St. George, Utah. Resident of Colonia Juárez and later president of the Juárez Stake.
- Rosenkilde, Anna. House girl employed by Helen.
- Sessions, Byron. Big Horn Stake president called in 1901. Born November 7, 1851, in Bountiful, Utah. Married Idella Win Twombly in 1870. Called to help colonize Bighorn Basin in 1900.
- Sessions, Idella Win Twombly. Wife of Byron Sessions. Born June 16, 1856. Married Byron Sessions in 1970.
- Smith, Bathesheba W. Fourth general president of the LDS Relief Society. Born May 3, 1822, in West Virginia. Married to George Albert Smith. Charter member of the Relief Society when Emma Smith presided. Received her endowments from the Prophet Joseph Smith.

- Smith, George Albert. Cousin to the Prophet Joseph Smith. Born June 26, 1817, to LDS Church Patriarch John Smith and Clarissa Lyman. Ordained an apostle in 1868 and served as first counselor to Brigham Young. Married to Bathesheba Smith.
- Smith, Hyrum Mack. LDS apostle ordained in 1901 by his father, Joseph F. Smith. Born March 31, 1872, to Joseph F. Smith and Edna Lambson. Married to Ida Elizabeth Smith.
- Smith, Ida Elizabeth Bowman. Wife of Apostle Hyrum Mack Smith.
- Smith, Joseph F. LDS apostle ordained in 1866 and named counselor in First Presidency by Brigham Young. Born November 13, 1838, in Far West, Missouri, to Hyrum Smith and Mary Fielding. Served as counselor to church presidents John Taylor, Wilford Woodruff, and Lorenzo Snow. Ordained fifth president of the church in 1901.
- Smoot, Reed. U.S. Senator elected in 1903 and apostle. Born in 1862 to Abraham Owen Smoot and Anne Kirstene Morrison.
- Snow, Lorenzo. Fourth president of the LDS Church. Set apart in 1898. Born April 3, 1813, in Ohio. Ordained an apostle in 1849. Served as counselor to Brigham Young. Married Sarah Ann Prichard, his third wife, April 21, 1845.
- Snow, Sarah Ann Prichard. Third wife of Lorenzo Snow. Born November 29, 1826.
- Talmage, James E. Apostle ordained in 1911. Born September 21, 1862, in England. Married May Booth June 14, 1888.
- Talmage, May Booth. Wife of LDS apostle James E. Talmage. Born 1868. Married June 14, 1888. Called to the YLMIA General Board in 1892.
- Tanner, Joseph Marion. General Superintendent of LDS Church Schools and member of General Sunday School Board, serving with Owen. Born March 26, 1859, in Payson, Utah. Received degree from Harvard University. President of the Agricultural College in Logan until he resigned in 1900 over polygamy. Husband of six wives, one of whom, Annie Clark Tanner, was a relative of Avery.
- Taylor, Elizabeth Campbell. Wife of Frank Young Taylor. Married in May 1844.
- Taylor, Elmina Shepherd. General President of the YLMIA. Born September 12, 1830, in Middlefield, New York. Married George Hamilton Taylor in 1856.
- Taylor, Frank Young. First President of the Granite Stake, set apart January 28, 1900. Born November 4, 1861. Son of President John Taylor and brother of Annie Taylor Hyde.
- Taylor, John Whittaker. LDS apostle ordained in 1884. Born May 14, 1858, in Provo, Utah. Son of John Taylor. Resigned apostleship in 1905 and was excommunicated in 1911.
- Taylor, Nellie Eva Todd. Polygamous wife of John W. Taylor, married September 23, 1888. Born January 13, 1869.

- Taylor, Rhoda Welling. Resident of Colonia Juárez. Married August 29, 1901, to John W. Taylor as polygamous wife along with her sister Roxie.
- Taylor, Roxie Welling. Resident of Colonia Juárez. Married August 29, 1901, to John W. Taylor as polygamous wife along with her sister Rhoda.
- Tingey, Martha Horne. General YLMIA President, succeeding Elmina Taylor in 1905. Born October 15, 1857, in Salt Lake City. Called as second counselor to President Taylor in 1880.
- Tippetts, Brigham L. First counselor in Big Horn Stake Presidency. Born August 1, 1880, in Brigham City, Utah. Member of original scouting party to the Bighorn Basin with Owen.
- Welch, Charles A. Second counselor in Big Horn Stake Presidency. Appointed by Owen to keep the books of the Bighorn Basin project and run the commissary.
- Wells, Heber M. First governor of Utah. Born August 11, 1859, to Daniel Wells and Martha E. Harris.
- Wells, Rulon. One of the Seven Presidents of the Seventy ordained in 1893. Born July 7, 1854. Served on the General Board of the YMMIA.
- Wilson, Guy Carlton. Principal of Juárez Academy, appointed in 1897. Born April 10, 1864, in Fairview, Utah. Supervisor of the LDS Church School System. Counselor to Anthony W. Ivins in Juárez Stake Presidency. Polygamist with three wives: Elizabeth Hartsburg, Agnes M. Stevens, and Anna Ivins.
- Winder, John R. Counselor in LDS Presiding Bishopric, set apart in 1887. Born December 11, 1821, in England. Set apart as counselor to LDS President Joseph F. Smith in 1901.
- Winters, Arthur Ray. Brother of Helen. Born May 16, 1871, in Pleasant Grove, Utah.
- Winters, Mary Ann Stearns. Mother of Helen. Born April 6, 1833, in Missouri. Married Oscar Winters August 16, 1852.
- Winters, Oscar. Father of Helen. Born February 7, 1825, in Ohio. Married Mary Ann Stearns August 16, 1852.
- Woodruff, Arabell Jane Hatch. Sister-in-law of Owen. Born April 2, 1859. Married David Patten Woodruff, Owen's half-brother, February 19, 1877.
- Woodruff, Asahel Hart. Brother of Owen. Born February 3, 1863, to Emma Smith and Wilford Woodruff in Salt Lake City. Married Naomi Abbott Butterworth December 14, 1887.
- Woodruff, Asahel Hart Jr. Nephew of Owen. Born February 13, 1893, to Asahel Hart Woodruff and Naomi Abbot Butterworth.
- Woodruff, Clara Martisha. Sister of Owen. Born July 23, 1868.
- Woodruff, David Patten. Half-brother of Owen. Born April 4, 1854, to

- Wilford Woodruff and Sarah Brown in Salt Lake City. Married Arrabell Jane Hatch February 19, 1877. Moved to Bighorn Basin in 1893 with first LDS colonists. Called to Big Horn Stake High Council in 1901.
- Woodruff, Emma Rose. Niece of Owen. Born in 1896 to Asahel Woodruff and Naomi Butterworth.
- Woodruff, Emma Smith. Mother of Owen. Born March 1, 1838, in Missouri. Married Wilford Woodruff March 13, 1853, as his third wife.
- Woodruff, Helen Mar. Daughter of Helen and Owen. Born January 1, 1901, in Salt Lake City.
- Woodruff, John Jay. Half-brother of Owen. Born August 14, 1873, to Wilford Woodruff and Sarah Delight Stocking. Married Annie L. E. Nielsen January 24, 1903.
- Woodruff, June. Daughter of Helen and Owen. Born June 24, 1902, in Salt Lake City.
- Woodruff, Naomi Butterworth. Sister-in-law of Owen. Born March 21, 1864, in England. Married Asahel Hart Woodruff in 1887.
- Woodruff, Rhoda. Daughter of Helen and Owen. Born December 28, 1903, in Salt Lake City.
- Woodruff, Ruth. Daughter of Avery and Owen. Born April 11, 1904, in Mexico.
- Woodruff, Sarah Delight Stocking. Fifth wife of Wilford Woodruff. Born June 26, 1838.
- Woodruff, Torrey Brigham Newton. Nephew of Owen. Born November 15, 1894, to Arabell Jane Hatch and David Patten Woodruff in Bighorn, Wyoming.
- Woodruff, Wilford, Jr. Half-brother of Owen. Born March 22, 1840, in Iowa to Phoebe Whittemore Carter and Wilford Woodruff. Married Emily Jane Smith in 1867 and later two plural wives.
- Woodruff, Wilford Owen. Son of Helen and Owen. Born October 31, 1899, in Salt Lake City.
- Young, Brigham, Jr. Son of Brigham Young. Born December 18, 1836. Ordained LDS apostle on February 4, 1864.
- Young, Seymour B. Physician and surgeon. Born October 3, 1837, to Jane Bicknell and Joseph Young in Kirtland, Ohio. Served as one of the Seven Presidents of the Seventy and later as an LDS apostle.
- Young, Zina D. H. LDS General Relief Society President. Born January 31, 1831, in Watertown, New York.
