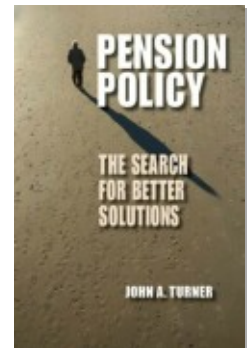

John A. Turner is director of the Pension Policy Center in Washington, D.C., which provides research and consulting on social security and pension policy. Previously, he worked at the AARP Public Policy Institute in Washington and at the International Labour Office in Geneva, Switzerland. He has also worked in research offices at the U.S. Social Security Administration and at the U.S. Department of Labor, where he served as deputy director of the pension research office for nine years. He has taught as an adjunct lecturer in economics at George Washington University and at Georgetown University in the Georgetown Public Policy Institute. He has lectured and consulted in more than 20 countries and has published 12 books and more than 100 articles. He is the author of three previous books for the Upjohn Institute, including *Individual Accounts for Social Security Reform: International Perspectives on the U.S. Debate*, published in 2006.
