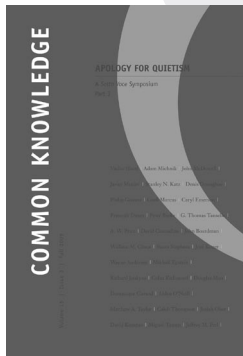


COMMON KNOWLEDGE

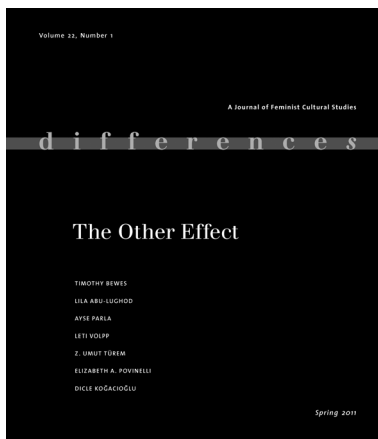
