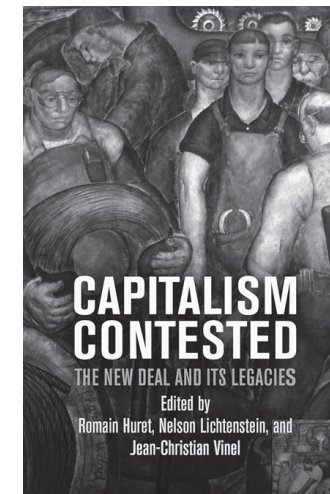

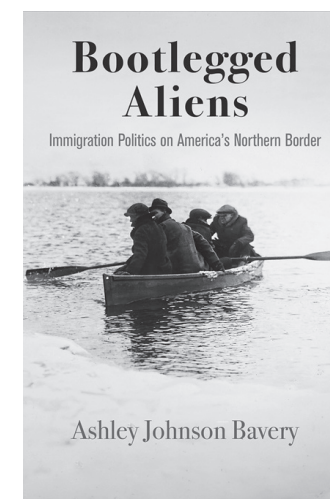

SUBMITTING TO CAPITALISM

Similarly, no unsolicited full review essays will be considered without submitting an initial proposal to the review essay editor.
