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The *Journal of American Folklore* (*JAF: A Global Quarterly*), the quarterly journal of the American Folklore Society since the Society's founding in 1888, publishes scholarly articles, perspective pieces, featured and reviewed project essays, and book reviews directed to a wide professional audience.

The content of *JAF* reflects a wide range of topics and points of view. As the flagship publication of the Society, *JAF* reflects concerns of members in both academic and public spheres, and it publishes materials on folklore and from folklorists anywhere in the world. In its commitment to inclusion, equity, and social justice, *JAF* invites contributions that critically engage topics associated with race, ethnicity, gender, sexuality, class, ability, religion, and citizenship. Content is grounded in past and current folklore scholarship, and is based on recognized disciplinary methods. Articles present significant research findings and theoretical analyses from the disciplinary perspective of folklore.

Article manuscripts should be submitted according to the guidelines outlined below and on the *JAF* website <https://americanfolkloresociety.org/journal/>. Submissions are acknowledged on receipt and are evaluated first by the *JAF* editorial staff, and then, if found appropriate for the journal, are sent for "double blind" review to two qualified referees. Outside reviews may take anywhere from a few weeks to several months to be completed. Authors are notified as soon as a decision has been made on whether to accept or reject a manuscript. Acceptance may be either outright or contingent on the completion of recommended changes. Rejection may be outright or with the possibility of revision and resubmission for a new evaluation. The editors reserve the right to reject or return for revision any material submitted, on the grounds of inappropriate subject matter, quality, or length. Submitted manuscripts should not have been published elsewhere and must not be under concurrent consideration by any other journal.

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
